INFORMATION ABOUT THE PROCEDURE

All students whose proposals meet the quality criteria are accepted – but how does a proposal look like?

Structure and **contents** of a successful proposal:

- Introduction
- Problem definition
- Relevance of the topic (for both theory & practice)
- Objective of the bachelor / master thesis
- Description of the procedure (no timeline)

We suggest you arrange a meeting / call with your supervisor before starting with the proposal. To learn about what a good proposal contains, read the Introduction-section of an article published in a top journal (e.g. JIBS, SMJ).

Make sure your proposal and thesis are properly formatted, citations are consistent, and your work is scientific

For example, use the **JIBS Style Guide**:

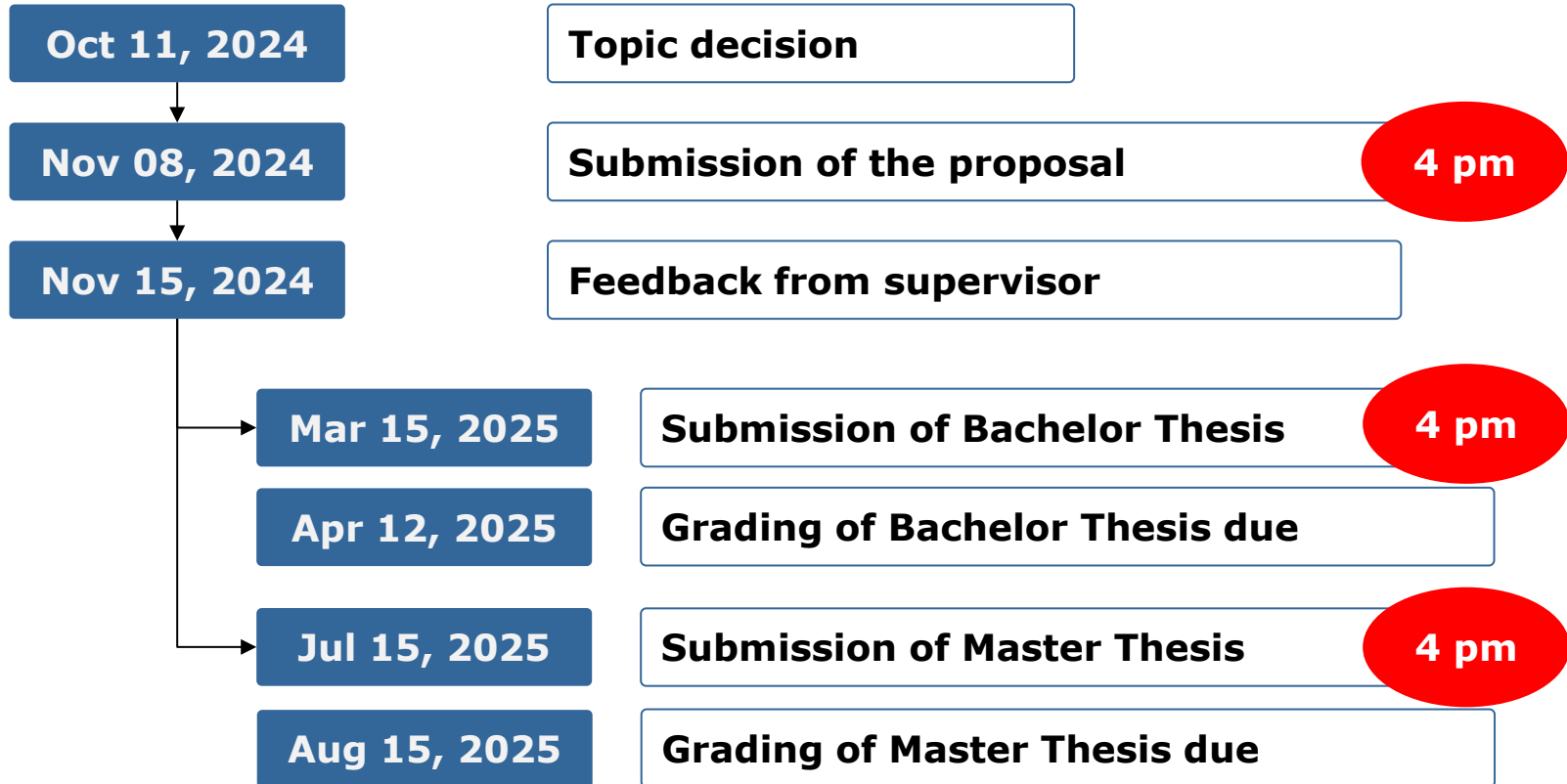

Plagiarism leads to appropriate consequences.

We have few rules, and to those we stick



“*What happens if....?*“ Follow the institute’s code of conduct to avoid negative consequences

You have filled out and signed the application form and thereby expressed your willingness to write a proposal, however, you **do not** submit the proposal on time (see chart 6), and you **have not** informed your supervisor before the deadline expires.

You are banned for the next topic assignment and the thesis you signed up for will not be supervised.

You have received the confirmation of academic supervision, but you **do not** hand in your thesis on time (see chart 6), and do not inform your supervisor about the issue.

You will not receive a grade and you cannot apply for the same topic again.

Further administrative rules that you should consider when writing your thesis

- We **do not** offer a pre-correction of your thesis at any stage
 - We **do** provide feedback on specific questions that arise during the writing process
- Upload final electronic version of thesis to Learn@WU: insert **Co-Examiner's** name (if applicable), **Examiner** of your thesis is always Prof. Fisch, Prof. Mohr, Prof. Nell, or Prof. Puck
(For BSc: also Dimitrova, Floh, Müllner, or Wolfesberger); Learn@WU link: <https://learn.wu.ac.at/open/guide/abschlussarbeiten>
 - Everyone needs to hand in **1 hardcopy** of their thesis at the IIB institute on time (see slide 6)
 - Master: A second hardcopy has to be handed in at WU main library, please inform yourselves about administrative requirements

How to handle questions and communication with your supervisor

You have specific questions about the topic you consider applying for?



Send an Email to the respective supervisor – he/she is happy to provide you with some more information about the topic.

You want to meet your supervisor to discuss specific administrative issues?



Check the institute's and the WU homepage for facts first. If you are not able to find the information you need, contact your respective supervisor via Email.

You need to have your thesis graded before the official deadline (see chart 6)?



Let your supervisor know right away when sending the filled application form.
