### Superleague - Breaking Up Monopolies?

In his recent article in the Austrian Law Journal, Fabian Ziermann and his co-authors discuss whether the Superleague decision could lead to a de facto divestiture of monopolies, in the sense that monopolists would have to divest control rather than assets.
