

Field Courses and Research & Policy Seminars



Field Courses

- 3-hour lecture
- Foundations, lecture format

- Up to 30 students
 (4 reserved for incoming students)
- AT: Take four Field Course

ST: Take three Field Courses

Research&Policy Seminars

- 2-hour seminar
- Students develop their own research projects, interacting closely with instructors
- Ideally 10-15 students

 (2 reserved for incoming students)
- Take two R&P Seminars (each corresponding to a Field Course)

Recommendation:

New Areas of Specialization



The new areas of specialization are **not** incorporated in the curriculum yet

→ In LPIS, they are listed under the label of "old" modules

Environmental Economics: "Economic and Social Policy" OR "Development Economics"

Geoeconomics: "Economic and Social Policy" OR "Spatial Economics"

You can only complete each module **once**.

Course Registration and Waiting Lists



NEW: Preference based allocation of R&P Seminar spaces

- Students state preferences in summer (online form)
- Program derives distribution and registers students for R&P Seminars (and corresponding Field Courses)
- Transparency
- More details in July

LPIS registration in mid-September

- Remaining Field Courses
- De-register R&P Seminars, register different/additional R&P Seminars

Electives



Criteria for courses to be eligible as Elective

- Related to economics
- Master's level
- Final grade

6 ECTS in total - you may combine multiple courses.

Electives – Types of Courses (1)



1. Courses offered by WU's MSc Economics

- All Field Courses and R&P Seminars
- Mandatory courses of the track that you are not enrolled in
 - Students in Science Track: Economic Policy, Heterodox Economics, Business Analytics, Public Economics, Topics in Macroeconomic Theory and Policy, and Topics in Applied Microeconomics
 - Students in Applied Track: all mandatory courses from Science Track except Game Theory

Registration:

- Field Course: via LPIS (or exam.master@wu.ac.at)
- R&P Seminar, mandatory course: <u>exam.master@wu.ac.at</u>

Electives - Types of Courses (2)



2. Other courses relating to economics on master's level offered by WU

Courses from other master's programs:

- Good coopertation with DigEcon, Socioeconomics, FiRe ("german-taught" but some courses in English),...
- QFin and SEEP currently do not allow for students of other programs
- Contact <u>masterECON@wu.ac.at</u> (providing a link to the course's syllabus)
- We will register you if
 - Course fulfils the necessary criteria in form and content
 - Other program agrees (free spaces)

"Additional Courses"

- Courses on master's level that are not part of master's curriculum
- <u>Course catalog</u> (Master's Programs/Additional Courses)
- If they fulfil the criteria (contact masterECON@wu.ac.at)
- Recommendations:
 - Scientific Working with R and LaTeX (registration in early September)
 - SOLV organized by ECON students

Electives - Types of Courses (3)

 - Check eligibility during pre-recognition process
